Beware of Caller ID Spoofing

Caller ID is a convenient feature that allows you to know the name and number of who's calling before you answer your telephone. Did you know that Caller ID is susceptible to fraud by a practice called Caller ID Spoofing?

Caller ID Spoofing is the practice of displaying caller ID information on a recipient's caller ID device which is not that of the actual originating caller. Spoofing can make a call appear to have come from any phone number the caller wishes to use and is generally done as a means to convince individuals to provide personal or financial information that enables the perpetrators to commit credit card, bank fraud or other forms of identity theft.

Reminder! Please do not give out personal information in person, over the phone, by mail, or on the Internet unless you have made the initial contact or you are absolutely certain you know the people to whom you are giving your information. An identity thief can pose as a representative of any type of business including a bank, a credit card company, and an Internet service provider. The spoofed call can sound very plausible.

Brownie Caramel Bites

Prepare one family-sized Betty Crocker
Supreme Brownie mix according to the
package directions. Spray a mini muffin pan
and fill each cup 2/3 full of the brownie batter.

Bake approximately 8 minutes at 350 degrees until the brownies are soft but done. Remove from oven and immediately push a Rolo caramel candy piece into each brownie.

Decorate by drizzling half of the brownies with white frosting and half with and chocolate frosting.

Makes approximately 4 dozen brownies.
